



Siren Vest (short version) Crochet Pattern

Changes to the Siren Vest pattern designed by Doris J Chan
(Interweave <http://www.interweavestore.com/siren-vest>)

Notes

1. Work as for Siren Pattern up to and including TRIM – Row 2.
2. I mainly use the largest size directions, which works out to approximately 34" – 36".
3. Work Row 3 if you think it needs to be a little longer – note: that the garment will drop approximately 1" with wearing.

Materials

Wool & Cotton Road Organic cotton 8 ply x 3 x 50gm skeins
Wool & Cotton Road Organic cotton flame 8ply x 3 x 50gm skeins

Crochet Hook size

9mm Crochet Hook

Knitters needle for sewing ends.

Tension

As it turns out – it will be different to the pattern due to the change in yarn. The effect is a smaller pattern definition than shown in the photo.

Abbreviations

As per the pattern – remember to change to our crochet terminology as follows:

sc = dc

dc = treble

tr = double treble

Pattern:

After TRIM Row 2: do not turn – continue to work up side, across neck and down side as follows:

EDGING

Working with right side showing shell in each circle of row end evenly up side, across neck and down side.

Slip stitch into end of last row of body.

Without turning, rope stitch in every second stitch up side, across neck and down side.

Rope stitch:

With right side of work facing, work from left to right.

1 ch, skip first stitch, 1 reverse dc in next stitch to the right, ch 1, skip 1 stitch, * repeat from * to * up side, across neck and down side. Slip stitch and fasten off.

ARMHOLES

Join yarn with a slipknot at bottom of armhole on the right side.

dc evenly around the armhole. Slipstitch to the first dc, do not turn.

Rope stitch back, as above, working from left to right.

Slipstitch to beginning and fasten off.

Repeat for the other armhole.

FINISHING

Sew in ends. I haven't been blocking, as I like the look of the vest without.

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
